am all rite now but not stout yet
Mother you ask me about Juliana she
is well and so is Billie and the baby
They call it Charles Henry after Billie's
brother it is a pritty baby and full of
mischief just what you would like
ma you spoke of the old bible and the
record if you want it I can get
it for you as for Juliana she means well
and so does Billie. They are
run with money yet but are doing awry
well I think they have begun to build
a home of their own they have some
horses and cattle I dont know how
many but a nice little bunch of each
and they have a good many hogs
and they have chickens too.
why they dont rite I could not say.
Juliana says to me every time nearly
that I see her that she must rite to you

and I have seen her several times this
summer and expect to see her soon
again and I will tell her to write
and to send the record to you
Well, I can't think of much
to write to day but will try
and write a long letter next time
