
NOVENA PRAYER

Caps on straight. Tassel over right front. No flowers or decorations on robes. Hands free except for program.

Be certain you are wearing the color tassel which designates the division of the College which you represent. Check your program to determine the division to which your major department belongs.

DIVISION OF EDUCATION - Tassel Color: Light Blue

DIVISION OF ENGINEERING - Tassel Color: Orange

DIVISION OF HUMANITIES AND ARTS - Tassel Color: White

DIVISION OF SCIENCES AND OCCUPATIONS - Tassel Color: Gold-Yellow

PROCEDURE IN LINING UP

1. Go to the track and field area and to the sign of your Division or Marching Group:

Masters Candidates	Division of Engineering
ROTC Commissioned Officers	Division of Humanities and Arts
Division of Business	Division of Sciences & Occupations
Division of Education	
2. Masters, military and all divisions form double lines
3. Be prepared to identify yourself to the monitor with the official list of graduates.
4. Hold and be prepared to show any identification given to you.
5. Ten minutes before 7:00 p.m., ranks will be closed and paired off. The official march will start at five minutes to seven.

PROCEDURE FOR MARCH

Stay in line and follow your faculty marshall. Seating will be by Division according to an arrangement known to the marshall. Follow instructions without argument.

PROCEDURE OF PROGRAM

Remain standing until the people on the platform are seated. Men uncover for the "Star Spangled Banner" and the Invocation.

PRESENTATION OF CANDIDATES

1. Conferring of the Baccalaureate Degree
  - a. Dean Gilbaugh will present the entire class to the President.
  - b. Dean Gilbaugh will present those graduating with Honors.
  - c.
    - (1) Qualifying for the degree with great distinction.
    - (2) Qualifying for the degree with distinction.
  - d. Dean Gilbaugh will then present the division deans to the President.
    - (1) Each division dean as introduced will present his division.
    - (2) Each division will stand for recognition and then be seated.
  - e. Dean Gilbaugh will again present the class to the President. All graduates rise.
  - f. The President will confer all the Baccalaureate Degrees at once.

When the granting of the degree is completed, you will shift your tassel from right front to left.

2. Conferring the Master's Degree
  - a. Dean Gilbaugh will present Dean Brown, Dean of Graduate Division to the President.
  - b. Dean Brown will present the Master Degree candidates to the President. The Master Degree candidates will rise to acknowledge the presentation and remain standing.
  - c. The President will confer the degrees.
  - d. You will remain standing until all have been hooded by designated faculty members of your division.
  
3. Presentation of those receiving a teaching credential to the President.
  - a. Dean Sweeney will present those receiving a teaching credential to the President.
    - (1) When your credential is called, please stand and remain standing to receive congratulations from the President.
  
4. Presentation of the commissioned officers.
  - a. Officers will be uniformed, but will march in gowns and will participate gowned as members of the Division with which they are graduating.
  - b. Gowns will be removed following the conferring of the Master Degree.
  - c. Dean Gilbaugh will present Lt. Col. Rios to the President.
  - d. Colonel Rios will ask you to rise to receive a word of congratulation from the President. You will then be seated.

#### CLOSING CEREMONY

With the last word of the President's congratulations to the officers and on baton signal from the director of the orchestra, ALL men and women in the exercise will rise.

Men will remove their caps while the band plays "Hail, Spartans, Hail". Remain standing for the benediction.

#### PROCEDURE OF RECESSIONAL

1. Following your Faculty Marshall, proceed to the table to receive your Graduation Booklet.
2. The following order will be the procedure for marching to receive your graduation booklet:

Masters candidates will proceed first with row one of the Masters section leading off to the right followed by rows three, five, etc. Row two of the Masters section will lead to the left followed by rows four, six, etc. Military and all divisions will follow the Masters candidates in single lines with row one of the left section following the Masters line on that side. Each row in that section will proceed left following the row ahead. Row one of the right section will follow the Masters line on that side. Each row in that section will proceed right following the row ahead.

#### ARRANGEMENTS TO TURN IN CAPS AND GOWNS

Following the formal exercises, return your cap and gown to the correct alphabetical booth in the track area. Separate booths will be established for Master's candidates and faculty.

#### DATA ON DIPLOMAS

Diplomas and diploma cases will be mailed to you after the grades have been checked.

## SJS Sheepskins for 2,617 —College's Largest Class

Dr. Frank C. Baxter, pioneer in educational television, last night told members of the largest graduating class in San Jose State College history to beware of getting sidetracked on the way toward reaching their goals in life.

"Life is like sand that will slip through your fingers," he warned.

"Time is precious."

Also addressing a huge audience of graduates and some 10,000 other spectators during the SJS commencement in Spartan Stadium, College President John T. Wahlquist noted with words of alarm that the number of graduates receiving teachers' certificates in this class was only 4 per cent larger than last year's number.

"... We shall have to double the teaching force at all levels — elementary, secondary and higher schools — in the next ten years," Dr. Wahlquist said.

In contrast to last year's commencement when 98-degree temperatures caused half a dozen cases of heat prostration, "frost bite" was the more likely danger in yesterday's chilly twilight air at Spartan Stadium.

Cars lined streets and filled industrial parking lots many blocks from the stadium, and many relatives walking long distances from parking locations were arriving 45 minutes after the program had begun.

A seemingly endless line of gowned graduates with sparkling faces filed into the stadium from the adjacent practice field as proud relatives snapped photos.

Baxter, whose lectures on Shakespeare constituted the first college course to be offered on television for academic credit, was the commencement speaker. He is a professor emeritus of English at the Univer-

sity of Southern California.

He reminded each graduate that he is really alone because he is not exactly like anyone else on earth.

"You must conform to your social world, but you must be interesting to yourself," he said.

Turning to the international scene, he commented, "Because the world has been so deeply wounded, you cannot expect serenity during your lifetime."

He deplored the fact that this is not a "reading nation" and chided his listeners who miss the wealth of other people's experiences one can have through that medium.

In all, 2,617 degrees were conferred this year, compared with 2,232 last year, a 17.2 per cent increase, Dr. Wahlquist noted in his report.

Noting that SJS more and more is becoming the place for upperclassmen and graduate students, he observed, "... We conferred 372 master's degrees, com-

pared with 258 last year, up 44.2 per cent."


Expressing regret that legislators eliminated money for research from the Governor's budget, he said:

"I feel we cannot attract or retain the best teachers, nor can we properly train our ever-increasing number of graduate students, unless we can involve both faculty and students in research projects."

He welcomed the support for research received for the first time this year from the local level — the Chamber of Commerce, local merchants and industries, Disabled Veterans and the Mexican Commission — among others.

Turning to salaries for the SJS teaching staff, Wahlquist noted they are "no longer as attractive as they were a few years ago."

He said "one of the most significant events of the year was the Honors Convocation... This was an effort to give the scholar some of the glory heretofore reserved for the athlete."



# No Time For Sixth Grade Math He

A legend is passing from the scene.

The legend of the single, party-time male college student.

In commencement lines this month will be many married men, fathers who worked while finishing their educations.

Four such fathers — three who get degrees from San Jose State College and one who receives a master of arts from San Francisco State College — feel that it's a hard but satisfying way to get an education.

As one of the fathers put it, "My wife knew I had to do it to be a happier man."

Quite a variance in jobs held by these men while they finished their studies.

Father of seven children ranging in age from 14 to 3 years, Robert Aldridge of Santa Clara works the swing shift, 5 p.m. to 1:30 a.m., at Lockheed's Sunnyvale plant, where he is a draftsman. He has been picking up courses to complete the two years of college he had left when he dropped out of California State Polytechnic College in San Luis Obispo back in 1948. For the past five years, averaging six units each semester, he has been taking evening and day classes at SJSC. He receives a B.S. in aeronautics from State next week.

Aldridge cites as reason for his strenuous schedule of work, school and parenthood, the improvement of earning potential to support his family. As for studying with seven children in a three bedroom house, Aldridge has worked his schedule so he does his homework while the children are in school.

With all his responsibilities, Aldridge can't spend as much time with the family as he would like. He is on a Boy Scout committee, and keeps weekends free of studies for his children. A favorite weekend pastime is camping, which Aldridge enjoys with just the boys, or with the whole clan.

A slow project, one he has been working on since last summer, is building a "run about" boat in his

garage. The children help, and when finished, the boat will be used for outings at one of the local dams.

This father and student, who has lived in Santa Clara since 1957 when the family moved from Watsonville, feels Lockheed encourages schooling among its employes by reimbursing some of the cost. After he receives his degree, Aldridge will return to the day shift at the company.

Even though Daddy—Jim Sayre—goes to school, the Sayre household in Spartan City, married student residences for San Jose State College on Seventh street, is a typically democratic one. The family votes on which television shows to watch, "but if there's a show I want to see, I see it," Sayre says.

Sayre, who completes his undergraduate studies in social science at SJSC this coming week, plans to attend another year to obtain a secondary teaching credential. Although he had been out of school eight years before beginning again, he says, "I'd do it again."

Studying, even in the close quarters at Spartan City, causes little trouble for Sayre, who can read when his three children go charging through the house. Although, he adds, there are periods when you feel everything's against you, he still wouldn't trade jobs with his wife.

"I'd rather go to school and work," he says, a decision he made after taking care of his son and two daughters, Timothy, 7; Stephanie, 5, and Susan, 3.

Before coming to San Jose State, Sayre took two years of college courses, sponsored by Bakersfield Junior College, at the U.S. Naval Ordnance Testing Station at China Lake, near his home in Trona, a Southern California desert town. Sayre, who had been working for American Potash Co. in Trona, gave up a job and seniority to fulfill a desire for teaching he has had since high school days.

"The worst thing was making the decision to move from Trona to here," he says. Both he and his wife were in favor of the move, which was encour-

aged by the reputation of SJSC as a teacher's college, and a friend in San Jose who got Sayre a job he still holds in the circulation department of the Mercury and News. Sayre works Monday through Friday from 5 to 8 a.m., and Saturday from 5 a.m. to 1 p.m. He also receives \$160 each month from the United States Government as a Korean War veteran.

Complications arose last summer, when Sayre contracted pulmonary tuberculosis and was forced to stay in a hospital for two months. He returned to school in September, but was not allowed to work again until February.

One goal Sayre has, when he finishes his schooling, is "to go someplace where kids can run and play."

Another father of three is Kent Patterson, who married his high school sweetheart, Sally, seven years ago when he entered the service after high school. All through his undergraduate days at San Jose State College — he completed the program in three years — his wife worked full time while he held some part-time positions. Now completing 60 post-graduate

units for a degree as a school psychologist, Patterson has been helped through this two-year program by scholarships. He also lives in Spartan City.

Currently, Patterson holds a full-time position at Ida Price Intermediate School, where he teaches half a day and acts as a counselor and psychologist, a tester, the other half.

"It's tiring at times," he admits, "but think of all the vacations you get." This business of being all things at once can vary in difficulty, according to Patterson, depending on how a class schedule is made up. "My kids are adjusted and we go out on weekends," he says.

"Good planning can make a difference."

This summer, Patterson, his wife and children move to Oxnard in Southern California, where he has accepted the position of district psychologist in the public schools.

For Otto Hirsch, the lapse of time between the beginning of his student days and the completion of his master's thesis has been over 20 years. Hirsch attended college in his native Czechoslovakia, but

left that country for the end of the war in 1945. A civilian employee U.S. Army, he was with the Japanese


Corridor and for three-and-one-half years in prison camps.

After the war came to the United States, he completed his education at the Berkeley campus of the University of California. He received a degree in physical therapy and worked for several years in that field.

Returning to San Francisco State College in 1957, Hirsch took courses and worked the day as a physicist and translator of scientific documents for the government. One made up his credit and he embarked on a graduate program that he married.

Hirsch, father of a month-old boy, a month old girl, a physical therapist, and a physical therapist, while he completed his master's thesis.



### College To Pay Tribute To 2116 at Graduation

San Jose State will pay tribute to Spartans receiving bachelor's and master's degrees June 15 at 7 p.m. during commencement exercises at Spartan Stadium.

At the event, a total of 1966 bachelor's and 219 master's degrees will be conferred on students completing their college work this month and last February.

A total of 577 students were eligible for bachelor's degree in February. Master's degrees were earned by 63 at the end of fall semester.

Bachelor's degrees will be conferred on 1529 graduates at the June commencement exercises who completed their work this month. Master's degrees for June completion will be conferred on 147 students.

Degrees will be conferred by President John T. Wahlquist. Dr. Frank C. Baxter, professor emeritus of English at the University of Southern California, will be the commencement speaker.

The speaker is a well-known teacher and lecturer on the literature of England and America, and especially on Shakespeare, the history of humor and the history of books and printing.

Although his television experience dates from the early experimental period in the 1930s when America's first television station went on the air, Dr. Baxter did not become a full-time TV personality until the fall of 1953.

His "Shakespeare on TV" was the first college course to be taught on television for academic credit in southern California.

### Class Honors Top Seniors

Of the 1966 Spartans to receive bachelor's degrees at the June 15 commencement exercises, three have been honored by the graduating class as outstanding seniors.

The honorees are Jud Clark, Ronald Gervais and Linda Hardin. They were recognized at the ABS Recognition banquet and the Senior Recognition banquet.



### College To Pay Tribute To 2116 at Graduation

San Jose State will pay tribute to Spartans receiving bachelor's and master's degrees June 15 at 7 p.m. during commencement exercises at Spartan Stadium.

At the event, a total of 1906 bachelor's and 210 master's degrees will be conferred on students completing their college work this month and last February.

## Last days just ahead



Built in 1898, Moreland Academy has been well known landmark

# Moreland convent to be demolished

The days of Moreland Notre Dame Academy, the 64-year-old four story landmark on Main St., are numbered. Plans revealed today call for its demolition this fall.

In place of the white Victorian structure, now a convent and formerly a girls boarding school, a new convent building will be erected.

For several years now, the building has been condemned and the top floor unused.

With the approval of the city Planning Commission and the city building inspector, the sisters of Notre Dame will occupy the old music rooms as temporary living quarters during demolition and construction.

The new building will serve the sisters. Tentative planning would include an infirmary, living quarters for 20 and visiting rooms and a chapel. The new convent will be constructed closer to the Main St. frontage than the present building. This will leave space for school use in the rear.

The proposed convent is described as single story in front and (r

story in back, with an enclosed patio.

A committee of 12 has formed to begin plans for the old building's demolition and erection of the new. A fund-raising campaign will be undertaken to finance the work.

No financial goal has yet emerged from the meetings.

A meeting with an architect, set for next week, will probably result in an estimate of the costs. Informed estimates of the cost place it at a "large amount."

In addition to providing temporary living quarters for the nuns while the work proceeds, some provision for dining facilities will be made. A cafeteria will be installed in the science room of the old high school building for this purpose.

Mitchell Resetar Jr. and Loretta Allison have been named co-chairmen of the committee of 12.

First constructed in 1898, the academy has served as a boarding school, a high school and a convent.

Sister Felicienne, in charge temporarily while the sister superior is absent, said, "I have no idea how many rooms are in the building. It would take a long time to

take up there in winter," she said.

At one time, the fourth floor housed girls who boarded at the school. When the boarding school days ended a few years ago, about 30 or 35 girls lived at the school. But years ago, there were many more girls than that who lived at the school.

For a while, too, the gingerbread-rich building served as a high school. That ended with the building of Mora Central High School.

At present, the academy serves as headquarters for the Pajaro Valley's only Catholic elementary school, enrolling both girls and boys. Its capacity is limited to exactly 410 pupils.

Some six nuns and three lay teachers compose the teaching staff now. Sister Gregory heads the school.

In addition to the nuns who teach at Notre Dame, most of the teaching sisters at Mora also live at Notre Dame.

Three buildings now occupy the land which runs from Main St. through to Brennan St. They are the original convent and school, the recently constructed "L" shaped elementary school and a rectangular shaped building which is at right angles to the academy and which contains the music
